This is to certify that this plat of lands and grounds has been designated and has been caused to be surveyed and platted by the Board of Park Commissioners of the City of St. Paul for the purposes of a public parkway for the use of said city to be called **COMO AND RIVER BOULEVARD** by and under resolutions of said board adopted Nov. 5th 1908, and comprising the following tracts of land situated in the city of St. Paul, to wit:— fill that part of Desnoyer Park Addition contained within the lines of a strip 120 feet wide, extending from the South line of St. Anthony Avenue to Mississippi River Boulevard, the center line of said strip being the center line of Pelham Street and Pelham Street produced South through Desnoyer Park Addition. The property taken and condemned is more particularly described as all those lots and parts of lots included within the above described 120-foot strip, as enumerated below:—

In Desnoyer Park Addition— Lot "C", lots 13 to 19 inclusive, and lots 28 to 34 incl., of Block 30; lots 8 to 14, incl., and lots 30 to 38, incl., of Block 29; lots 4 to 13, incl., of Block 28; lots 29 to 33, incl., of Block 22; lots 2 to 7, incl., of Block 23; lots 1 to 15, incl., of Block 4; lots 1 to 15, incl., of Block 5; lots 16 to 30, incl., of Block 6, and lots 16 to 30, incl., of Block 7; also all of lots 4, 5, 6 and 7, Block 23, East of said 120-foot strip.
