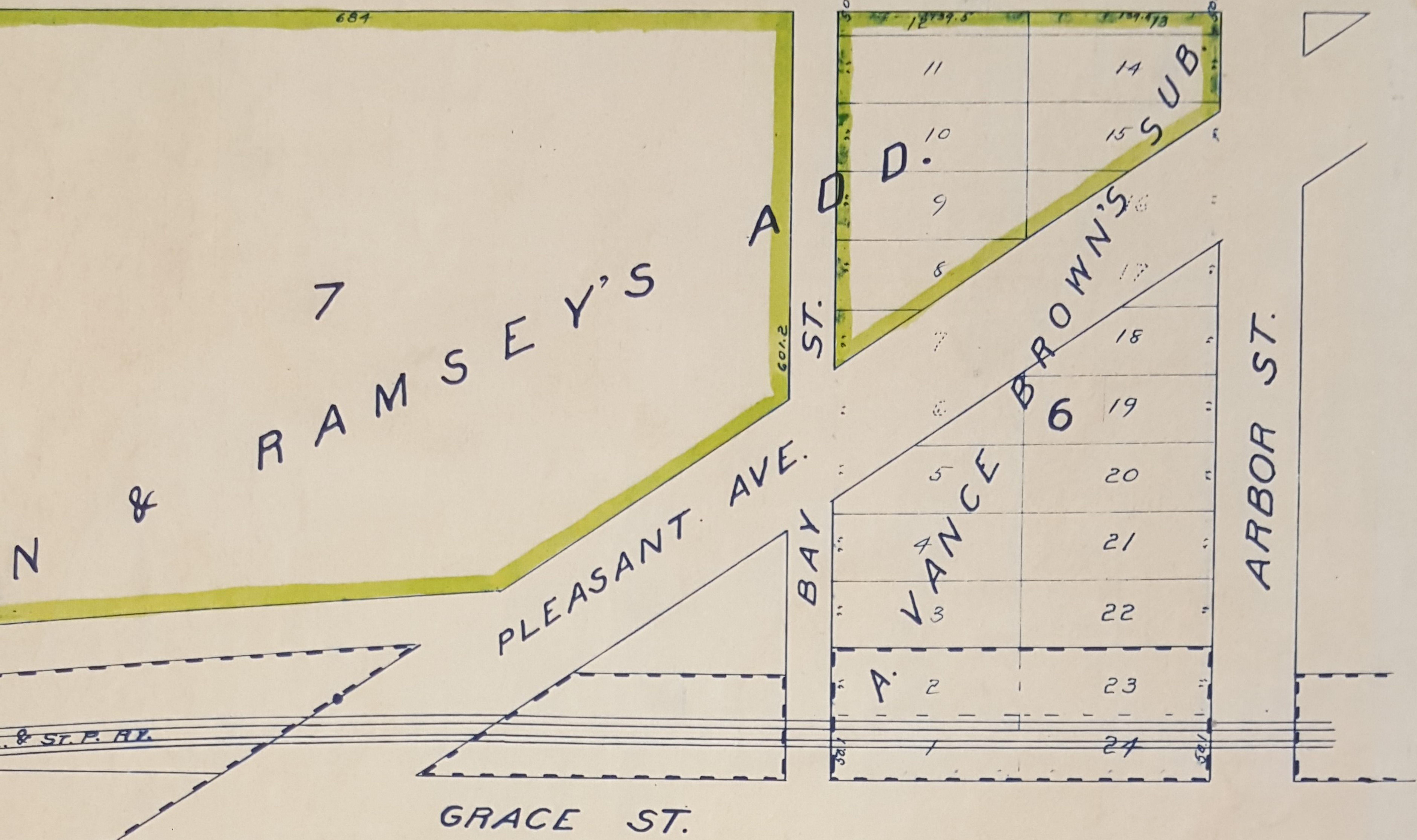


AIR ST.
