



NEW CANADA TOWNSHIP

New Road

7.6 miles

Whereas upon the petition in writing of 16 legal voters residing within one mile of the route hereinafter described for a public highway a copy of their petition having been first duly posted as required by law we the supervisors of said town did on the 16th day of October, 1873. personally examined the route proposed in said petition for a road to-wit: As already described in said petition and having before determining to lay out said road fixed upon a time and place when and where we would meet to hear any reasons for or against the same and having caused written notices thereof to be posted up in three public places near the line of said road 10 days previous to the time and such meeting and having met at the time and place appointed for hearing such reasons and having heard such answers offered for or against the laying out said road and being of opinion that such laying out is proper and necessary and that the public interest would be promoted thereby and having granted the prayer of said petition and determined to lay out said road we did on the 16th of Oct. 1873, cause a survey thereof to be made by a competent surveyor who made report to us as follows:

The undersigned having been employed by you to make a survey of a road as follows:

From a point on the St. Paul and Little Canada road, where it crosses the line between sections 29 and 30, of township 29, range 22, thence north along the line between sections 29, 30, 19 & 20, thence to intersect the present road at the most convenient point, would report that the following is a correct survey thereof as made by me under your direction, to-wit:

Beginning at a point in the St. Paul and Little Canada road on the line between sections 29 and 30, of township 29, range 22, thence north 12.75 chains to the corner of sections 19, 20, 29 and 30, thence north on the line between sections 19 and 20, 80.00 chains to the corner of sections 17, 18, 19 and 20, thence north on line between sections 17 and 18, 79.80 chains to the corner of sections 7, 8, 17 and 18, thence north on line between sections 7 and 8, 20.00 chains to quarter quarter post thence N. 26° east, 15.00 chains to the present St. Paul and Little Canada road and that herewith is a correct plat of said road according to said survey, Dated at St. Paul this 16th day of January, 1874.

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It is therefore enforced and determined that a road be and the plat thereunto annexed and made part of this order which is hereby declared to be a public highway 4 rods wide the line of said survey being the center of said road.

PETITION - NEW ROAD

Nov. 11, 1873

To the Supervisors of the Town of New Canada,
County of Ramsey, State of Minnesota:

The undersigned legal voters, residing within one mile of the road to be laid out, hereby petition you to lay out a new road of the width of four rods as follows: From a point on the St. Paul and Little Canada road where said road crosses the line between Sections 29 and 30, T. 29, N. R. 22 W., thence North along Section line between 29 and 30 and Sections 19 and 20, and thence to intersect the present road at the most convenient point. The names of the owners of the land through or on which the road is to pass which are known to your petitioners are the following:

The Southeast quarter of Section 19 and W $\frac{1}{2}$ S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 20, - J. W. Bass. The names are not known of the owners of the following lands over which said road is to pass, to-wit:

From starting point in Sections 29 and 30, the N.E. quarter of Section 19 and N.W. quarter of Section 20, and land in Sections 17 and 18, and 8,

and your petitioners pray that you will proceed to lay out said road and cause the same to be opened according to law.
