SUPERVISORS ROAD ORDER

September 30th, 1902

Whereas, upon the petition of eleven (11) legal voters, who are free-holders and residents of said town, within three miles of the road proposed in said petition to be layed out, copies of said petition having been first duly posted up in three of the most public places of said Town, at least twenty days before any action was had in relation thereto, proof of which posting was duly shown to us by affidavit; which said proposed new road is set forth and described in said petition as follows, viz:

Beginning at the center of section eight (8) Township thirty (30) Range twenty-three (23) thence running west through the west half of Section eight (8) and through section seven (7) to the west boundary line of said Town of Mounds View.

And Whereas, upon receiving said petition, we did, within thirty days thereafter, make out a notice and fix therein a time and place at which we would meet and decide upon such application, to-wit: On the 10th day of September A.D. 1902, at the residence of R.W. Phillips, causing copies of such notice to be posted in three public places in said Town at least ten days previous to such meeting; and having met at such time and place as above named in said notice, and being satisfied that the applicant had, at least ten days previous to said time, caused said notice of time and place of hearing to be given to all the occupants of the land through which such highway might pass, by serving the same personally or by copy left at the usual place of abode of each of said occupants, proof of which was shown by affidavit, we proceeded to examine personally such highway, and heard any and all reasons for or against laying out the same, and being of the opinion that such new road was necessary and proper, and that the public interest would be promoted thereby, we granted the prayer of said petitioners, and determined to lay out said road, and caused a survey thereof to be made according to the report and plat herewith accompanying, the description of which as so laid out is as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the center of Section eight (8), Township thirty (30) Range twenty-three (23) thence running west through the west half of Section eight (8) and through section seven (7) to the west boundary line of said Town of Mounds View.

It is therefore Ordered and Determined that a road be, and the same is hereby layed out and established according to the description last aforesaid, and the report and plat herewith accompanying, which is hereby made a part of this Order, and it is hereby declared to be a public highway four rods wide, the said description above given being the center of said road.

Given under our hands, this 30th day of September, A.D. 1902.

State of Minnesota, County of Ramsey, Town of Mounds View, St.

Whereas, Upon the petition of eleventh (11) legal voters who own real-estate or who occupy real estate under the homestead or preemption laws of the United States, or under contract from the State of Minnesota, within three (3) miles of the road proposed in said petition to be laid out, which said petition was filed with the Town Clerk, who forth with presented it to us for action thereon, and which said proposed new road is set forth and described in said petition as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the center of section (8), township (30), range (57), thence running west through the west 1/2 of section (8), and through section (7), to the west boundary line of said Town of Mounds View,

and Whereas, Upon receiving said petition, we did, within thirty days thereafter, make out an order or notice of hearing and fix therein a time and place at which we would meet and act upon said petition, to-wit:

On the 10th day of September, 1902, at the residence of R. S. Phillips, causing copies of such notice to be posted in three (3) places in said Town, at least ten days before such meeting; and having met at such time and place as above named in said notice, and being satisfied that the petitioners had, at least ten days previous to said time, caused said notice of time and place of hearing to be given to all the occupants of the land through which such road might pass, by serving the same personally upon each of said occupants, proof of which was shown by affidavit, we proceeded to consider personally such roads, and heard all persons interested, and say and all reasons for or against the laying out the same, and being of opinion that said road was necessary and proper, and that the public interest would be promoted thereby, we granted the prayer of said petitioners and determined to lay out said road, and caused a survey thereof to be made according to the report and plat herewith accompanying, the description of which as so laid out is as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the center of section (8), township (30), range (57), thence running west through the west 1/2 of section (8), and through section (7), to the west boundary line of said Town of Mounds View,

It is Therefore Ordered and Determined, That a road be, and the same is hereby laid out and established according to the description last above said, and the report and plat herewith accompanying which is hereby made a part of this Order, and it is declared to be a public road four (4) rods wide, the said description above given being the center of said road.

## AWARD OF DAMAGES

STATE OF MINNESOTA, County of Ramsey, Town of Mounds View, SSJ

Whereas, A road was laid out on the 30th day of September, 1902, by us, the Supervisors of the said Town of Mounds View on the petition of eleven (11) legal voters who own real estate or who occupy real estate under the homestead or prescription laws of the United States, or under contract from the State of Minnesota, within three (3) miles of said road, which said road is set forth and described in the foregoing Supervisors' Order, made by us, and

Whereas, A part of the damages sustained by reason of the laying out said road has been ascertained by the agreement of the owners of the lands through which said road passes, with us, and a part of the owners of the said lands have in writing released all claims to damages; but not being able to agree with the owners of the following described lands, viz: damages by reason of said road passing through, and the owners of some of the said lands being unknown we have assessed the damages to each of said individual claimants with whom we could not agree, and awarded damages to the owners of such lands through which said road passes as are unknown, of what we deemed just and right; taking into account and estimating the benefits the road will confer on the claimants and owners, as well as the disadvantages. We have assessed and awarded damages as follows:

No names of owners of lands or description of lands or award of damages are given. In case of the following lands and claimants for damages, we estimate that the advantages and benefits said road will confer on them are equal to all damages sustained by them by reason of laying out said road, to-wit:

COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S BOOK "V"

One-mile of Town Road Constituted as County Road

County Surveyor Coates reported that after an investigation and inspection of the town road running through the center of sections 7 and 8, township 30, range 23, which by resolution it was desired to constitute as a County Road, at a meeting of July 7th, that it is felt advisable to take over one mile of said road, namely, that part thereof running through the center of section 8, which will afford a connection with Cleveland Avenue and the Long Lake Road north of New Brighton; in view of this fact, Commissioner Leinen introduced the following resolution, resolved, that road running from the quarter section corner on the west line, section 8, township 30, range 23, Easterly to the quarter section corner on the east line of said section, a distance of one-mile, be and the same is hereby declared and constituted a County Road.

Resolved further, that the County Surveyor be directed to furnish this Board with estimate of cost for improving the same by grading and graveling.

The motion was then adopted by the following vote: Ayes, Carr, Cross, Keller, Leinen, Lind and Nelson; Nays, none

DECLARING COUNTY ROAD
