


Road Order & Surveyor's Report.

Whereas, upon the petition in writing of six legal freeholders residing within one mile of the route hereinafter described for a public highway, a copy of their petition having been first duly posted as required by law, supervisors of said fown, did on the 13th day of Nov., 1869, personally examine the route proposed in said petition for a road, to-wit:

Commencing at the T most between sections 15 4 22 of T. 29, R. 23. due E. along the S. line of Sections 15 & 14, thence Worthwardly on the most practicable route to the Town Line between Rose and New Canada, and having before determined to lay out said road, fixed upon a time and place, when and where we would meet to hear any reasons for or against laying out the same,

And having caused written notices thereof to be posted up in 3 public places near the line of said road, 10 days previous to the time of such meeting, 4nd having not at the time and place appointed for hearing such reasons, and having heard such as were offered for or against the laying out of said road, and being of opinion that such laying out is necessary and proper and that public interest would be pronoted thereby; and having granted the prayer of said petitioners and determined to lay out said road, We did, on the 30th day of Nov. 1869, cause a survey to be made by a competent surveyor who made report to us as follows:

Beginning at the 1 post between Sections 15 & 22 marked "0", theme E. 126, chains to corner of Sections 13, 14, 23, and 24, themes N. 5555 chains, themes N. 540 N. 3.10 chains, N. 420 N. 1.75 chains, N. 120 N. 6.00 chains, N. 6 N. 10.00 chains, N. 13.20 N. 17.35 chains, N. 480 N. 15.60 chains, N. 300 N. 35,45 chains, N. 680 N. 25.50 chains, to New Canada and Rose Township line 11.50 chains N. 1700 corner of Sections 7, 12, 13, & 18.

The undersigned two of the County Commissioners to whom an appeal was taken from an order of the Supervisor of the town of Rose in said county, dated the 12th day of Feb., 1870, filed in the office of the Town Clerk of said town on the same date, locating a road four rods wide, and running as follows:

Commencing at the 2 post between Sections 15 & 22, T. 29, R. 25, thence due S. along the S. line of Sections 15 & 14, thence N'ly on the most practicable route to the town line between Rose and New Canada, and which appeal was dated Mar, 10th, 1870, and a copy whereof is hereinto annexed. Do hereby report; that we said commissioners to whom the said appeal was taken, having daly met on the said proposed road near the house of G. Wohnson, one of said spellants named in said notice of appeal, in said Town of Rose, on the 15th day of June, 1870, at two o'clock, P.W., when and where there were present and appeared before us, L. S. Woodruff and W. Hermes, two of the Supervisors of said Town and John Hardy, Thomas P. Briggs, John Piggot, 3 of the petitioners for said road and also Johanna Robertson, Martin Bruggermann, G. Johnson, J. Johnson, H.A. Weylit, Christian Schlossmaker in person and by their attorney, and Ira A. Ramsey by his attorney, appellants in said notice of appeal, and did them and there hear the proof and allegations of said parties. No objection being made to the regalarity of said appeal. That we the said commissioners did first consider the propriety and expediency of locating the said road, and do now find and determine that the same should be located in accordance with the prayer of said petition and the same order of said Supervisors. And that they also considered the subject of damages, the same having been embraced in said appeal under which they were acting, and after having duly considered the same, we do find, determine and report that the benefits occurring to the several parties named in said notice of appeal, by reason of the location of said road, will be fully equal to any damages which they will sustain by reason of such location of said road over and across the real estate of said appellants. And they do further adjudge and determine that the said order of said Supervisors appealed from, be and the same is hereby in all things approved and confirmed.
