WHEREAS, A petition signed by twenty-four freeholders of said County, praying for the astablishing of a certain highway in said County, rumning east and west from the courter section between Sections 3 and 10, Township 30, Range 23, on the section line one-half mile to the section corner between sections 2, 3, 10 & 11 of said Town and Range, and not within the limits of any incorporated city, as hereinafter described, was presented to this Board at its session on the seventeenth day of August, 1931, and this Board having determined by the judgment of a majority of its members that said petition is reasonable on its face, and having by its order appointed Monday, the sixteenth day of Movember, 1931, at tem o'clock A. M., at C. H. and C. H. Building, St. Paul, in said County, as the time and place for a herring upon said petition, and having by said order appointed a committee of its members to evamine said proposed route of said road and designated Thursday, the twelfth day of Movember, 1931, at two o'clock P. M., at the intersection of Hamlime Avenue and County Road "I" in said County, as the time and place for said committee to meet on the route of said proposed road, for the examination of the same, and having caused notices of said hearing and said meeting of said countitee embodying a copy of said petition, to be posted in the three most public places of each town through which said proposed route of said road runs, or affected thereby, at least thirty days before the day of said hearing upon said petition and being satisfied that said notices were so posted and proof of said posting duly made, and the said committee having set at the time and place designated in said order and said notices, and examined the same and made its report in writing to this Board, and recommended that said petition be granted, and said Board having set at the time and place designated in said order and said notices, to-wit, at C. H. and C. H. Building, St. Paul, in said county, on Monday, the sixteenth day of Movember, 1931, at t

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, That the prayer of said petition be and the same is hereby granted, and said highway is hereby established so as to run according to said committee's report, by courses and distances as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the warter section between Sections 3 and 10.
Township 30, Range 23, and running thence East on the section line between said sections one-half ( ) wile to the section corner between Sections 2, 3, 10 & 11 of said Town and Range.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That the County Auditor notify the Town Supervisors of each town through which said road is proposed to be established of the fact of said establishment and that they shall cause to be opened and established so much of said highway as lies in their respective towns.

AND WHEREAS, At the said hearing upon said petition and said report of said committee, certain persons over whose lands said road

as proposed to be established will pass did remonstrate against granting the prayer of said petition and did set forth in writing that they sould be damaged in a sum therein mentioned by the establishment of such road, and made oath and subscribed to the same, and said Board has determined from said report and the evidence before them, the amount of the damages sustained by said persons and that said proposed establishment of said road is of sufficient advantage to said County to warrant the paying of the damages assessed by this Board, the said Board proceeded to assess said damages at what is deemed just and right to each land owner, taking into account the advantage and benefits of said establishment of said highway as well as the disadvantages and damages.

Commissioner Gibbs explained that, after viewing this proposed road, the committee were of the opinion that the same was necessary in view of the fact that it completes the missing link in COUNTY ROAD "I" and would be of particular benefit to that part of the northern end of the county in view of the fact that no cross road exists at this point unless one travels one mile north or two miles south.

Hearing on the petition having been set for today, the Chairman inquired as to whether any one desired to be heard in favor of or against the granting of said petition.

L. N. Thompson, Engineer for the Water Department of the City of St. Paul, objected to the granting of a id petition in view of the fact that the highway, when constructed and if placed on the center line, would be only fifteen feet from their water conduit, which might be damaged by reason of the awampy condition of the land adjoining.

Commissioner Gibbs pointed out that this road could be constructed on the south line of the right-of-way which would leave more space between the traveled road and the conduit. Mr. Thompson, however, felt that the fill from the newly constructed road would have a tendency to push the conduit north and cause considerable damage.

County Surveyor Coates stated that the road could not be built on the southerly part of the right-of-way in view of the fact that ditches must be provided for as well as the necessary slopes.

The possibility of shifting this road farther south so as to get away from the Water Works right-of-ray as much as possible was discussed. It was ascertained that the cost involved would not be any greater if this were done and the desired result could be obtained just as well as by placing the road in its proposed location.

Commissioner Churchill suggested that the matter be referred to a special committee for the purpose of ironing out this difficulty and objections which Mr. Thompson offered.

Commissioner Peter, however, stremuously objected to the granting of this petition on the ground that the establishment of this road is unnecessary at this time due to the expense involved in improving the same in a short time.

The Town Board of Mounds View were present and spoke in favor of establishing the road as petitioned for in order that this district may be provided with a through cross road.

The Engineer's estimate for improving said high say was stated to be \$5,170,00.

Assistant COUNTY ATTORNEY McConnelous submitted an OPINION concerning the legality of the proceedings pertaining to the establishment of COUNTY ROAD "I" from Hamline Avenue to Lexington Avenue, and advised that, in view of the fact that the COMMITTEE appointed to view this road sere not all present at the time and place designated, any further proceedings in the establishment of this highway would be void. In a similar case in Dakota County the District Court held that the provisions of the statute with regard to this matter are mandatory, and, in a memorandum file, stated that failure of the County to comply with the law in this respect is fatal to further proceedings. In the event that it is desired to proceed with the establishment of this road, another committee should be appointed and due posted and published notice given as required by law.

Hearing on the PETITION for ESTABLISHING COUNTY ROAD "I" between Hamline and Lexington Avenues was taken up.

Commissioner Gibbs reported that the Committee appointed for the purpose of examining the route of said proposed road and reporting thereon desired further time for said purpose.

George W. Ellis, owner of property south of the proposed road, spoke in favor of establishing same as, in his opinion, this road, is a necessity and benefit to this territory. Truck gardeners and farmers would have a more direct route into the city.

The ditches along this road, after construction, will drain to a great extent property which now is wet in the spring. This draine age would be west and into Mud Lake.

County Surveyor Coates stated that the county has never built or designed roads for drainage purposes.

A. H. Skibs, Chairman of the Town Board of Mounds View, outlined his views with respect to this road, and urged that the same be established as a necessity and a more direct route into the City, The only cross roads at present are one mile north and two miles south.

Commissioner Gibbs also urged that this road be established and explained traffic conditions in this territory, and how this road would help conditions and truck gardeners of this district.

Commissioner Peter stated, after viewing the route of said road, that he saw no immediate necessity for opening the same,

Discussion was then had as to what legal action could be taken at this time to grant the request of the committee for further time, and to continue the viewing and hearing without further published and posted notice.

Some doubt existed as to whether the Board lost jurisdiction in the event of a continuation, Commissioner Gibbs moved, seconded by Commissioner Stewart, that the hearing be continued to 10:00 o'clock A. M., Monday, November 16, 1931, and that the County Attorney be requested for an opinion by October 5th concerning the legality of the proceedings up to this time, and also as to whether the Board may continue the date, hour and place for the Viewing Committee to examine the route of said road, and continue the date of hearing on the petition without giving published and posted notice, and motion carried by the following vote: Ayes - Carr, Gibbs, Peter, Stewart, Swan, and Churchill, Mays - None.
