Whereas, upon the petition of six legal voters, who own real estate, or who occupy real estate under the homestead or pre-emption laws of the United States, or under contract from the State of Minnesota, within one mile of the road proposed in said petition to be laid out, copies of said petition having been first duly posted up in three of the most public places of said Town, at least twenty days before any action was had in relation thereto, proof of which posting was duly shown to us by affidavit; which said proposed new road to be laid out is set forth and described in said petition as follows, viz:

Beginning at the northwest corner of section line (2) in Town thirty (30) Range twenty-three (23) in town of Mounds View Ramsey County and southwest corner of section thirty-one (31) in town thirty-one (31) range twenty-two (22) in the town of Centerville Anoka County on the town and county line of the same running due east on said line to the intersection of the county road known as the St. Paul and Kettle River road.

And Whereas, upon receiving said petition, we did, within thirty days thereafter, make out a notice and fix therein a time and place at which we would meet and decide upon such application, to-wit: On the 20th day of July A.D. 1885 at one o'clock in the afternoon at the house of Charles Hillson causing copies of such notice to be posted in three public places in said Town at least ten days previous to such meeting; and having met at such time and place as above named in said notice, and being satisfied that the applicant had, at least ten days previous to said time, caused said notice of time and place of hearing to be given to all the occupants of the land through which such highway might pass, by serving the same personally or by copy left at the usual place of abode of each of said occupants, proof of which was shown by affidavit, we proceeded to examine personally such highway, and heard any and all reasons for or against laying out the same, and being of the opinion that such new road was necessary and proper, and that the public interest would be promoted thereby, we granted the prayer of said petitioners, and determined to lay out said road, and caused a survey thereof to be made according to the report and plat herewith accompanying, the description of which as so laid out is as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the northwest corner of section two (2) in Town of Mounds View Ramsey County and southwest corner of section thirty-one (31) in Town thirty-one (31) range twenty-two (22) in the town of Centerville Anoka County on the town and County line of the same. Running due east on said line to the intersection of the County road known as the St. Paul and Kettle River road.

It is therefore Ordered and Determined that a road be, and the same is hereby laid out and established according to the description last aforesaid, and the report and plat herewith accompanying, which is hereby made a part of this Order, and it is hereby declared to be a public highway four (4) rods wide, the said description above given being the center of said road.

AWARD OF DAMAGES

STATE OF MINNESOTA, County of Ramsey, Town of Mounds View, SS:

WHEREAS, a road was laid out on the 20th day of July, A.D. 1885, by us, the Supervisors of the said town of Mounds View on the petition of six (6) legal voters who own real estate or who occupy real estate under the Homestead or pre-emption laws of the United States, or under contract from the State of Minnesota, within one mile of said road; which said road now is set forth and described in the foregoing Supervisors' Order, made by us, and-----

Whereas, a part of the damages sustained, by reason of the laying out new said road has been ascertained by the agreement of the owners of the lands through which said road passes, with us, and a part of the owners of the said lands have in writing released all claims to damages; but not being able to agree with the owners of the following described lands, claiming damages by reason of said highway passing through, and the owners of some of the said lands being unknown, we have assessed the damages to each of such individual claimants with whom we could not agree, and awarded damages to the owners of such lands through which such highway passes as are unknown, at what we deemed just and right; taking into account and estimating the advantages and benefits the road will confer on the claimants and owners, as well as the disadvantages.
