and whereas upon receiving said petition we did within thirty days thereafter make out a notice and fix therein a time and place at which we would meet and decide upon such application to wit, on the (6) sixth day of October A. D. 1881 at the house of Hugh Hanlon at (2) two o'clock P. ROAD PETITION

June 13, 1881

Record of a Town Road known as the Hanlon and Hipps Road, Road Petition. To the Supervisors of the town of Mounds View in the County of Ramsey and State of Minnesota.

The undersigned legal voters who own real estate or who occupy real estate under homestead and preemption laws of the United States or under contract from the State of Minnesota within one mile of the road to be laid out hereby petition you to lay out a new road four (4) rods wide as follows: Beginning at the $\frac{1}{2}$ post between section twenty (20) and section seventeen (17) thence running south on laid half $\frac{1}{2}$ section line as near as practicable to connect with the Minneapolis and Long Lake road on Section Twenty nine (29) in said town of Mounds View.
