Road between Ranges 22 & 23

The following report was read.

September 3, 1899.

The special Committee to whom had been referred a petition in reference to laying out a road running northerly on the line of Township 29, between ranges 22 and 23 from St. Paul to a point of intersection with the St. Paul and Kettle river road beg leave to report.

Your Committee have been over the ground and find that with the exception of about three quarters of a mile the road could be rendered available for travel.

That there is about three quarters of a mile of the land hilly and not more so than much other ground over which roads are already made. We deem the laying a road in the direction specified in the petition as very necessary and expedient and while we do not think the finances of the County would warrant an appropriation for the construction of the road at present, we would recommend that the road as prayed for in the petition be laid out and recorded.

The map and field notes for road along the range line of Ranges 22 and 23 was ordered to be engraved and map received as follows:

Field Notes

Commencing at a point where the range between Ranges 22 and 23 intersect the limits of St. Paul, and running thence north along said range line 195.60 chains.

- Station 2. N. 44° East 5.20 chains
- 3. N. 12° 45' W. 16.40 chains
- 4. North 195.60 chains

To intersect the St. Paul and Kettle River Road.
