ORDER LAYING OUT a New Road.

WHEREAS, upon the Petition in writing of thirteen legal voters, residing within one mile of the route hereinafter described, (the _____ of which is prayed for in said Petition), a copy of their petition having been first duly posted, as required by law, we the Supervisors of said town, did, on the 25th day of July, A.D. 1873, personally examine the route proposed in said petition for a new road to-wit:

Commencing at the east end of Fourth Street in Murrays Addition to White Bear, thence east across the land and tracks of the L.S. M. R.R. Co. between the Depot and Tank house to Railroad Avenue in the Town of White Bear,

and having, before determining to lay out said road, fixed upon a time and place when and where we would meet to hear any reason for or against the laying out of the same, and having caused written notices thereof to be posted up in three public places near the line of said road ten days previous to the time of such meeting, and having met at the time and place appointed for hearing such reasons, and having heard such as were offered, and being of the opinion that such laying out of the said road is necessary and proper, and that the public interest would be promoted thereby, and having granted the prayer of said petitioners, and determined to lay out the said road, we did, on the 8th day of August, A.D. 1873, cause a survey thereof to be made by a competent Surveyor, who made report to us, as follows, to-wit:

To the Supervisors of the Town of White Bear in the County of Ramsey, and State of Minnesota.

The undersigned having been employed by you to make a survey of a Road beginning at the east end of Fourth Street in Murrays Addition to White Bear, thence east across the Railroad between the Depot and Tank house to Railroad Avenue in the Town of White Bear, and would report that the following is a correct survey thereof as made by me under your directions, to-wit:

Starting at a stake in the centre of the east end of Fourth street in Murrays Addition to White Bear running along the centre of said road which is *Actual declination correction* Sixty six feet wide - N 79°00' E - 329 feet thence south 71° 12' E - 288.2 feet to the West line of Railroad Avenue 101.7 feet south of the south line of Fourth Street in the Town of White Bear.

It is, therefore, ordered and determined that the said Road be and is hereby laid out and established according to said survey, and the plat herunto annexed and made part of this order, which road is hereby declared to be a public highway four rods wide, the line of said survey being the center of said Road.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, WE the said Supervisors, have herunto set our hands, this 22nd day of August, A.D. 1873.

To the Supervisors of the Town of White Bear in the County of Ramsey, and State of Minnesota:

The undersigned, legal voters, residing within one mile of the route hereinafter mentioned and described for a road, do hereby petition to you to lay out a new road, of the width of four rods, as follows:

Commencing at the County Road known as the Saint Paul and Bald Eagle Lake Road at a point where Fourth Street in Murrays Addition to White Bear intersects said road, thence east to land of L.S. and M. Div. of N.P.R.R., thence across said R.R. land between the Depot and Tank house, so-called, to what is as Railroad Avenue in the Town of White Bear, on the most eligible route to _____

The names of the owners of lands over which the same is to pass, which are known to your petitioners, are the following:

J. C. Murray, J. B. Murray and Lake Superior and Mississippi
Division of Northern Pacific Railroad.

And your petitioners pray that you will proceed to lay out said road, and cause the same to be opened according to law.
