

SUPERVISORS' ROAD ORDER

For a Cartway

Nov. 18, 1901

WHEREAS, upon the Petition in writing of A. E. Becker, F. W. Benson, J. Ferrault, J. H. Semelton, Ed. Thomson, V. H. Hall, H. K. Getty, F. E. Whittaker, J. H. Spink, Phil Long, Joseph Reif, eleven legal voters residing within two miles of the cartway hereinafter described, (the laying out of which is prayed for in said Petition,) a copy of their petition having been first duly posted, as required by law, we, the Supervisors of said town, did, on the 18th day of November A.D. 1901, personally examine the route of the cartway proposed in said petition, to-wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the new proposed County road running alongside R.R. about one thousand feet North of the Southwest Corner of the Southwest Quarter, S.W. 1/4, of the Northwest Quarter, N.W. 1/4, of Section One, 1, Town Thirty, 30, Range Twenty-two, 22, thence running West parallel through Lot Three, 3, Section Two, 2, Town Thirty, 30, Range Twenty-two, 22, to Bald Eagle Lake,

and having, before determining to lay out said cartway, fixed upon a time and place when and where we would meet to hear any reasons for or against the laying out of the same, and having caused written notices thereof to be posted up in three public places near the line of said road ten days previous to the time of such meeting, and having met at the time and place appointed for hearing such reasons, and having heard such as were offered, and being of the opinion that such laying out of the said cartway is necessary and proper, and that the public interest would be promoted thereby, and having granted the prayer of said petitioners, and determined to lay out the said cartway, we did, on the 18th day of November A.D. 1901, cause a survey thereof to be made by a competent Surveyor, who made report to us, as follows, to-wit:

To the Supervisors of the Town of _____ in the County of _____ and State of Minnesota.

The undersigned having been employed by you to make a survey of a Road beginning at _____

would report that the following is a correct survey thereof as made by me under your directions, to-wit:

It is, therefore, ordered and determined that the said Road be and is hereby laid out and established according to said survey, and the plat herewith annexed and made part of this order, which road is hereby declared to be a public highway two rods wide, the line of said survey being the center of said Road.

To the Supervisors of the Town of White Bear in the
County of Ramsey and State of Minnesota:

The undersigned, legal voters, residing within one mile of the
route hereinafter mentioned and described for a road, do hereby petition to
you to lay out a new cartway of the width of two rods, as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the new proposed County road
running alongside R. R. about one thousand feet North of the Southwest
Corner of the Southwest Quarter, S.W.1/4, of the Northwest Quarter, N.W.1/4,
of Section One, 1, Town Thirty, Range Twenty-two, 22, thence running West
parallel through Lot three, 3, Section Two, 2, Town Thirty, 30, Range
Twenty-two, 22, to Bald Eagle Lake.

The names of the owners of lands over which the same is to pass,
which are known to your petitioners, are the following:

F. W. Benson S.W.1/4 of N.W.1/4 Section 1, Town 30, Range 22
" Lot 3 " 2, " 30, " 22

And your petitioners pray that you will proceed to lay out said
cartway and cause the same to be opened according to law.
