Whereas, upon the petition of six legal voters owning real estate within one mile of the road proposed in said petition to be discontinued, copies of said petition having been first duly posted up in three of the most public places of said town, at least twenty days before any action was had in relation thereto, proof of which posting was duly shown to us by affidavit, which said proposed discontinuance is set forth and described in said petition as follows, viz:

Beginning at the Southwest Quarter of Section Two (2), Town Twenty-nine (29), Range Twenty-three (23), known as the Jackson Farm and owned by John Reiling; so much as was rendered vacant by a change of new road of the distance of Thirteen Hundred and Twenty feet (1320) and also the part of said road not opened or used running through the Northeast quarter of Section Ten (10), Town and Range aforesaid, running parallel with the Railroad to the half section line, said land owned and occupied so far as known to your petitioners by William Gould and whereas, upon receiving said petition we did, within thirty days thereafter make out a notice and fix therein a time and place at which we would meet and decide upon such application, to-wit: on the 21st day of November, 1882 at one o'clock in the afternoon; we met on the said premises and then adjourned to the Town House in said Town of Rose, causing copies of such notices to be posted in three public places in said town at least ten days previous to such meeting, and having met at such time and place as above named in said notice and being satisfied that the applicant had at least ten days previous to said time, caused said notice of time and place of hearing to be given to all the occupants of the land through which such highway might pass, by serving the same personally or by copy left at the usual place of abode of each of said occupants, proof of which was shown by affidavit, we proceeded to examine personally such highway and heard any and all reasons for or against discontinuing the same; and being of the opinion that such discontinuing was necessary and that the public interest would be promoted thereby, we granted the prayer of said petitioners and determined to discontinue said road and the same is hereby discontinued.

PETITION ACCEPTED

November 7, 1882

The petition of William Gould, John Reiling and others; to discontinue that portion of the Road in the southwest quarter of section two (2) town twenty nine (29) Range twenty three (23) known as the Jackson farm; and owned by John Reiling; so much of the above road as was rendered vacant. By a change of new Road of the distance of Thirteen Hundred and twenty feet 1320; and also that portion of the same road running west through the north east quarter of section ten; Town and Range aforesaid; to the half section line; parallel with the Rail Road.

The Board accepted the above petition; and directed the usual notices; to be posted; appointing Tuesday the 21st day of November, A. D. 1882 to meet at the house of William Gould at one o'clock in the afternoon, to hear all reasons for or against discontinuing the aforesaid Road.
