

PETITION FOR ESTABLISHING COUNTY ROAD

To the County Board of the County of Ramsey, Minnesota:

The undersigned freeholders of the County of Ramsey hereby petition your Honorable Board for the establishment and alteration of a highway, running (1) which forms a direct connecting link with two or more roads in the town, adjoining the town in which road, is, or is to be, located, of said County, and not within the limits of any incorporated city, and described as follows:

(2) See plat attached, and running thence: See plat attached.

"A parcel of land in the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section fourteen (14) Township twenty nine (29) N. Range twenty two (22) W. beginning at a point 657.72 East and 279.56 feet South of NW corner of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section fourteen (14) Township twenty nine (29) N. Range twenty two (22) W, thence N. 50° 04' E. 185.21 ft. thence East 103.03 ft. thence S. 50° 04' W. 243.55 feet, thence North 85.94 ft. to the point of beginning, comprising approximately 0.70 acres."

And is to be connected with two other roads as follows: See plat attached and terminating at, See plat attached.
