



DECLARING COUNTY ROAD

Mar. 1, 1937

WHEREAS Larpenteur Avenue from Lake Avenue to White Bear Avenue has been heretofore improved and established as a public highway by a Federal W. P. A. project, and

WHEREAS, the South one-half of said road is located within the corporate limits of the City of St. Paul and the North one-half of said road is located in New Canada Township

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That the North one-half of Larpenteur Avenue from Lake Avenue to White Bear Avenue, in New Canada Township be, and the same is hereby constituted and declared a county road, pursuant to authority granted under Section 2582, Mason's Statutes of Minnesota for 1927.

Adopted by the affirmative vote of all members present.

PETITION FOR A NEW ROAD

July 9, 1878

"To the Supervisors of the Town of New Canada,
County of Ramsey and State of Minnesota:

The undersigned legal voters residing within one mile of the road to be laid out, hereby petition you to lay out a new road of the width of four rods as follows; Commencing at the county line dividing the counties of Ramsey and Washington, and on the section line dividing Sections 13 and 24, Township 29, Range 22, thence running due Westerly along said Section line and between Sections 13, 24, 14, 23 and 15 and 22, Township 29, Range 22 aforesaid until it intersects the St. Paul and White Bear road on the West. The names of the land owners over which the road is to pass which are known to your petitioners, are the following:

Whereas, upon the petition of six legal voters residing within one mile of the road proposed in said petition to be laid out, copies of said petition having been first duly posted up in three of the most public places of said town at least twenty days before any action was had in relation thereto, which said proposed new road as set forth and described in said petition is as follows: Commencing on the County line dividing the Counties of Ramsey and Washington, and on the Section line dividing Sections 13 and 24, Township 29, Range 22, thence running due Westerly along said Section line and between Sections 13, 24, 14, 23 and 15 and 22, Town. 29, Range 22, aforesaid, until it intersects the St. Paul and White Bear Road on the West" etc. as described in the above petition and notice. And whereas, upon receiving said petition we did within thirty days, make out a notice and fix therein a time and place at which we would meet and decide upon such application, to-wit: on the 14th day of June A.D. 1878 at the house of W. H. Busch on Section 15 in said town, causing copies of such notice to be posted in three public places in said town, at least ten days previous to such meeting and having met at such time and place as above named in said notice, and being satisfied that the applicant had at least ten days previous to said time, caused said notice of time and place of hearing to be given to all the occupants of the land through which such highway might pass, by serving the same personally or by copy left at the usual place of abode of each of said occupants, proof of which was shown by affidavit, we proceeded to examine personally such highway and heard any and all reasons for or against laying out the same, and being of the opinion that such laying out was necessary and proper, and that the public interest would be promoted thereby, we granted the prayer of said petitioners and determined to lay out said road, the description of which is as follows to-wit: Commencing etc. as described in the above petition.

It is therefore ordered and determined that a road be and the same is hereby laid out and established according to the description aforesaid, and the report and plat accompanying which is hereby made part of this order, and it is hereby declared to be a public highway four rods wide, the description above given being the center of said road.

PETITION FOR A NEW ROAD

To the Supervisors of the Town of New Canada

The undersigned legal voters, residing within one mile of the road to be laid out hereby petition you to lay out a new road of the width of four rods as follows:

Commencing at the county line dividing the counties of Lundy and Washington and on the section line describing sections 13 & 24, Township 29, Range 22, thence running due westerly along said lines and between sections 13, 24, 14, 25 & 15 & 22, Township 29, Range 22, aforesaid until it intersects the St. Paul and White Bear road on the west. The names of the land over which the road is to pass which are known to your petitioners are the following:

Abraham Schofield and others and your petitioners pray that you will proceed to lay out said road and cause the same to be opened according to law, Dated 24th Day of April 1878. That on the 13th Day of May 1878 petitions were posted in three (3) of the most public places in said town. Notice was also given to the Supervisors of said town of New Canada to meet on the 14th Day of June 1878 at 10 o'clock in the forenoon at the house of William K. Dorch in section 15, for the purpose of personally examining the routes named in said petition for a new road and for hearing all reasons for or against said proposed new road. We have examined personally such highway and heard any and all reasons for or against laying out the same and being of the opinion that such laying out was necessary and proper and that the public interest would be promoted thereby we granted the prayers of said petition and determined to lay out said road as per said description of said petition and hereby declared to be a public highway four rods wide.
