whereas, Upon the petition of ten (10) legal voters who sum real estate or who occupy real estate under the homestend or pro-amption laws of the United States, or under contract from the State of Nime, within three (3) miles of the read proposed in said petition to be inid out & rods wide which said petition was filed with the Town Clock, who forthwith presented it to the for action thereon, and which said proposed road is set forth and described in said petition as follows, wist

Beginning at a point on the north side of the Su, quarter of section 25 running die south half quarter line of section 25, through 5%, quarter of 26, and NV, quarter of section 33, thirty-three, where it somewhe with the Lake Johanna and Finneapolis Books,

And Thoreas, Upon receiving said potition we did, within thirty days thereafter, make out an order or notice of hearing and fix themses a time and place at which we would neet and not upon said potition, together.

On the 18th day of June, 1853, at one o'clock at the house of June Jarrell and dawsing sopies of such notice to be posted in three public places in said form, at least ten days before such meeting; and having not at such time and place as above mused in said notice, and being satisfied that the petitioners had, at least ten days previous to said time a same of the land through which such read night pass, by serving the same personally upon each of said assupants, proof of which was shown by affidavit, we proceeded to examine personally such reads, and hear all persons interested, and any and all reasons for or against the laying eat the same, and being of opinion that such new read was messenary and proper, and that the public interest would be promoted thereby, we granted the proper of said p titioners and determined to lay out said read, and cause a survey thereof to be made according to the report and plat herealth accompanying. The description of which as so laid out is as follows, to-write

AFARD OF DAMAGRE

State of Mirmesota, County of Remesy, flown of Mounds View, 85:

Therene, A road was laid out and located on the 18th day of June, 1853, by us, the Supervisors of the said Sows of Mounds Vice on the petitions of ten (10) logal voters who own real estate or who compy real estate under the homestead or pre-emption laws of the United States, or under contract from the State of Minnesota, within three (3) wiles of mid road, which said road being as new laid is set forth and described in the foregoing Supervisors* Order, made by us, and-

Whereas, A part of the damages sustained by reason of the laying set the new said road has been ascertained by the agreement of the owners of the lands through which said road passes, with us, and a part of the evenue of the said lands have in writing released all slaims to damages; but not being able to agree with the owners of the following described lands, claiming damages by reason of said road passing through, and the evenue of same of the said lands being unknown, we have assessed the damages to each of such individual claimants with when we could not agree, and swarded damages to the owners of such lands through which such thed passes at are unknown, at what we deemed just and right; taking into assessed and extinating the benefits the road will confer on the claimants and owners, as well as the disadvantages. We have assessed and awarded damages as follows:

Minutes of a meeting of the board of Supervisors of the town of Mounds Flow, held in surveyance to the notices properly posted and copies served in case of a cartway petitioned for by Thomas Posket and others held on the 15th day of November, 1885 at the house of Thomas Posket the majority of the board present namely S.A. Thompson and Joseph Schutha supervisors the parties not being all there to consider with, we adjoined until Saturday Nov. 27. at the hour of 1 o'clock P.M. at the same place the house of Thomas Posket to take final action. The board met at the house of J.M. Patter in said town said County present S.A. Thmopson Chairman, Henry Schulze and Joseph Skibe, the board met in pursuance of a notice of hearing for the purpose of hearing any reasons for or against laying out a town road from the hopse of J.M. Patten to New Brighton the board granted the prayer of the petitioners and will cause said road to be opened according to law. The board also directed the overseer of highways in road district No.5 to expend \$75.00 in said district to improve town roads also to have the railing on railroad bridge extended to make it safe for teams. Dated August 20, 1888.
