ORDER LAYINGCOUT A NEW ROAD

Whereas, upon the petition in writing, of Felix Labarre, Felix Peter uzuzm, Mitchell Tardiff, Endras Auges, Joseph Auges, E. O. Rene, and Paul Le-Barre, seven legal voters, residing within one mile of the road hereinefter de-Asscribed, (of which is prayed for in said petition) a copy of their petition having been first duly posted, as required by law, we, the Supervisors of said town, did on the 6th day of July, A.D., 1872, personally exemine the route proposed in said petition for a road to-wit: Commencing at the town read that runs East and West on Section line between Sections 25 and 36, thence Merth on quarter section line of Sections 25 and 24 to White Bear Lake on said quarter line and having, before determining to lay out said road, fixed upon a time and place when and where we would meet to hear any reasons for or against the laying out of the same, and having caused written notices thereof to be posted up in three wills places near the line of said road ten days previous to the time of such meeting, and having net at the time and place appointed for hearing such reasons, and having heard such as were offered, and being of the opinion that such laying out of said road is necessary and proper, and that the public interest works be y moted thereby, and having granted the prayer of said petitioners, and determined to lay out the said road, we did, on the 5th day of August, A. D., 1572, sense a survey thereof to be made by a competent surveyor, who made report to us, as follows, to-wit: To the Supervisors of the Town of White Bear in the Sounds of Remsey and State of Minnesota:

The undersigned having been employed by you to make a survey of a Road, beginning at the cuarter section corner post on the South boundary of Section twenty-five (25), thence North along the quarter section of said section \$7 to section twenty-four (24), thence north along the quarter section line of said section twenty-four (24) to the South shore of White Bear lake, and would report that the following is a correct survey thereof as made by me under your direction,

to-wit:

And that below is a correct plat of said road, according to said survey.

It is, therefore, ordered and determined that said road be and is hereby laid out and established according to said survey, and the plat hereunte annexed and made part of this order, which road is hereby declared to be a public highway four rods wide, the line of said survey being the center of said Road.

PETITION FOR NEW ROAD

To the Supervisors of the News of Thite Bear in the County of Remsey and State of Minnesota.

The undereigned, legal voters, residing within one mile of the reute hereinafter mentioned and described for a road, do hereby petition to you to lay out a new road of the width of four rods, as follows:

Commencing at the Town road that runs East and West on Section line of Section 25 and 36, thence North on quarter (2) Section line of Sections 25 and 24 on the most eligible route to White Bear Lake on said quarter (2) section line.

The names of the owners of lands over which the same is to pass, which are known to your petitioners, are the following: August Preba, Joseph Auger, Mitchell Tardiff, Felix Labarre, and others unknown to your petitioners.

And your petitioners pray that you will proceed to lay out said read, and cause the same to be opened according to law.

We, the undersigned Supervisors of the town of White Bear in the County of Ramsey having on the 13th day of September, A.D., 1872, upon due application made to us for that purpose, laid out a road as follows: Commencing at the town road that runs East and West, on section line of sections 25 and 36, themsee Worth on quarter section line of sections 25 and 24 to White Bear Lake, on said quarter section line,

To August Reaba we estimate the damages to his land at twenty-five (25,00) dollars, to Jos. Auger, Felix Labarre, Mitchell Mardiff and others unknown, we estimate that the advantages and benefits, said road will confer, on the land owned by the above named parties along the line of said road, are equal to all damages sustained by them, by reason of laying out of said road.

Agreement of Damages

We, the Supervisors of the Town of White Bear, in the County of Remeey, having on the 23nd day of July A.D. 1874 upon due application made to us for the purpose of laying out a road as follows: Commencing at the town road that runs East and West from the County line to the Labore Road said read known as the Section line road, at a point on said form road where the charter section line of Section 25 intersects said road, thence North on the quarter section line of Section 25 and 24 to White Bear Lake, and certain symmet of lands over which the road passes to-wit: August Preaba, Joseph Auger, Mitchell Lordiff, R. M. Staigg, Felix Labarre, Jennie D. Heskins, R. B. Gabusha, J. E. and J. E. Fisher and others unknown, not having released all damages sustained by reason of laying out and spening the same and not having agreed upon the amount of such damages, though we applied to them, and each of them, for that purpose, and endeavored to make such agreement, we proceeded to assess the same at what we deemed just and right to each individual claimant. taking into account, and estimating the advantages and benefits the read will confer on the claimants for the same, as well as the disadvantages and have assessed the damages to each as follows: To August Preaba, on the Wi of Wi Af SE of Sec. 25, at \$50.00, being enclosed and partly cultivated land; to Jos. Auger on the SE of SW of Sec. 25 am Mitchell Lardiff and Felix Laberre on the NE; of SW and the SE; of MW, Jennie D. Hoskins on the NE; J. E. and J.A. Fisher on the NE; of the NW all in Sec. 25 and R. M. Staigg on Lots 1 and 2 in Section 24 and others unknown, through which the read may pass, we estimate that the advantages and benefits, said road will confer on the above named parties are equal to all damages sustained by them by reason of laying out said road.
