DECLARATION
Mar. 1, 1937

WHEREAS, Larpenteur Avenue from Lake Avenue to White Bear Avenue has been heretofore improved and established as a public highway by a Federal W.P.A. project, and

WHEREAS, the South one-half of said road is located within the corporate limits of the City of St. Paul and the North one-half of said road is located in New Canada Township

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED That the North one-half of Larpenteur Avenue from Lake Avenue to White Bear Avenue, in New Canada Township be, and the same is hereby constituted and declared a county road, pursuant to authority granted under Section 2582, Mason's Statutes of Minnesota for 1927.

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SUPERVISORS' ROAD ORDER

Whereas, upon petition of eight legal voters owning real estate within one mile of the road proposed in said petition to be laid out, copies of said petition having been first duly posted up in three of the most public places in said town at least twenty days before any action was had in relation thereto, which said proposed new road is set forth and described in said petition as follows, viz: Set forth as described in the petition. And whereas upon receiving said petition we did, within thirty days, make out a notice and fix therein a time and place at which we would meet and decide upon such application to-wit: on the 30th day of March A.D. 1878, at the house of John Brochman on Section 13 in said town, causing copies of such notice to be posted in three public places in said town at least ten days previous to such meeting and having met at such time and place as above named in said notice, and being satisfied that the applicants had at least ten days previous to said time, caused said notice of time and place of hearing to be given to all the occupants of the land through which such highway might pass by serving the same personally or by copy left at the usual place of abode of each of said occupants, proof of which was shown by affidavit, we proceeded to examine personally such highway and heard any and all reasons for or against laying out the same, and being of the opinion that such laying out was necessary and proper and that the public interest would be promoted thereby, we granted the prayer of said petitioners and determined to lay out said road, a survey of said road having been made and a plat thereof put on file in the Clerk's office, the description of which is as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at a point on the county line between Washington and Ramsey Counties, where the section line between Sections Twelve (12) and Thirteen (13) intersects said county line between Sections Twelve (12) and Thirteen (13), Eleven (11) and Fourteen (14), until it intersects the road that runs to Mud Lake; thence running due West along said section line one mile, more or less, until it intersects the section line between Sections Thirteen (13) and Fourteen (14), thence due South along said last named section line one mile, more or less, until it intersects the section line between Sections Fourteen (14) and Twenty-three (23), thence due West along said last named section line until it intersects the White Bear Lake road.

It is Therefore Ordered and Determined that a road be and the same is hereby laid out and established, according to the description aforesaid and the report and plat accompanying it, which is hereby made a part of this order. And we, the Supervisors of said town, taking into consideration the advantages and benefits the said road is and confers on the owners of lands on which the said road, as described in the above petition, We assess the damages to each and everyone of the said owners, the sum of ten cents.
