At a meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of said County held April 3rd, 1888, a copy of the report of the Committee appointed by us at our last session, to examine the road hereinafter named, having been duly returned, by which said report it appears that the said Committee met at the time and place designated in our order of appointment and examined the highway proposed to be vacated, viz:

Beginning at the Northeast corner of the Northwest quarter of Section Twenty-three (23), Township Thirty (30), Range Twenty-two (22) in said Ramsey County, Minnesota, thence South 24 degrees West 10 chains, thence South 7½ degrees West 8 chains, to a point or place of beginning of that portion of said road to be vacated, thence in a Southwesterly direction to a point where said road meets or intersects the North line of Whitaker Street in Lake Shore Add. to White Bear, according to the recorded plat thereof on file in the office of the Register of Deeds for said County, and recommended that the prayer of the petitioners for the vacation of said highway be granted; and a majority of the Board of County Commissioners being of the opinion that the public interest would be promoted by the vacation of said highway and that the vacation of said road would be of sufficient advantage to the County to warrant the paying of the damages hereinafter assessed,

We do Hereby Order and Determine that the prayer of said petitioners be granted, and that a highway be and is hereby vacated according to the description above given.

We have assessed the damages sustained by reason of the vacation of said road to the lands over which the same passes and to the owners thereof, as follows:

Adeline E. Hinckley, benefits equal to damages

Nicholas Peterson, benefits equal to damages
