DECLARATION

Feb.2,1920
To the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Ramsey, Minnesota.

The East and West Road known as Larpenteur Avenue, being 66 feet in width the center line of which is the South erly line of Sections 14 and 13. situated in the Township of New Canada in Ramsey County Minnesota, extending from White Bear Avenue on the West to the Ramsev County line on the east a distance of two miles, excepting the southerly portion of said road thru Section 14. being within the City Limits of St. Paul, and to be connected with other roads as follows said road connects with White Bear Avenue in such county out side the City of St. Paul, but leading into the said City of St.Paul.

On motion of Keller, seconded Carr, said road was designated and declared to be a County Road, the same not being within the corporate limits of an organized village or town within Ramsey County, subject however, to the approval of the County Surveyor and County Attorney. Same carried by the following vote: Ayes: Carr, Churchill, Farrell Freeman, Lind and Hodgson.

Whereas, upon the petition of six legal voters residing within one mile of the road proposed in said petition to be laid out, copies of said petition having been first duly posted up in three of the most public places of said town at least twenty days before any action was had in relation thereto, which said proposed new road as set forth and described in said petition is as follows: Commencing on the County line dividing the Counties of Ramsey and Washington, and on the Section line dividing Sections 13 and 24, Township 29, Range 22, thence running due Westerly along said Section line and between Sections 13, 24, 14, 23 and 15 and 22, Town. 29, Range 22, aforesaid, until it intersects the St. Paul and White Bear Road on the West" etc. as described in the above petition and notice. And whereas, upon receiving said petition we did within thirty days, make out a notice and fix therein a time and place at which we would meet and decide upon such application, to-wit: on the 14th day of June A.D. 1878 at the house of W. H. Busch on Section 15 in said town, causing copies of such notice to be posted in three public places in said town, at least ten days previous to such meeting and having met at such time and place as above named in said notice, and being satisfied that the applicant had at least ten days previous to said time, caused said notice of time and place of hearing to be given to all the occupants of the land through which such highway might pass, by serving the same personally or by copy left at the usual place of abode of each of said occupants, proof of which was shown by affidavit, we proceeded to examine personally such highway and heard any and all reasons for or against laying out the same, and being of the opinion that such laying out was necessary and proper, and that the public interest would be promoted thereby, we granted the prayer of said petitioners and determined to lay out said road, the description of which is as follows, to-wit: Commencing etc. as described in the above petition.

It is therefore ordered and determined that a road be and the same is hereby laid out and established according to the description aforesaid, and the report and plat accompanying which is hereby made part of this order, and it is hereby declared to be a public highway four rods wide, the description above given being the center of said road.
